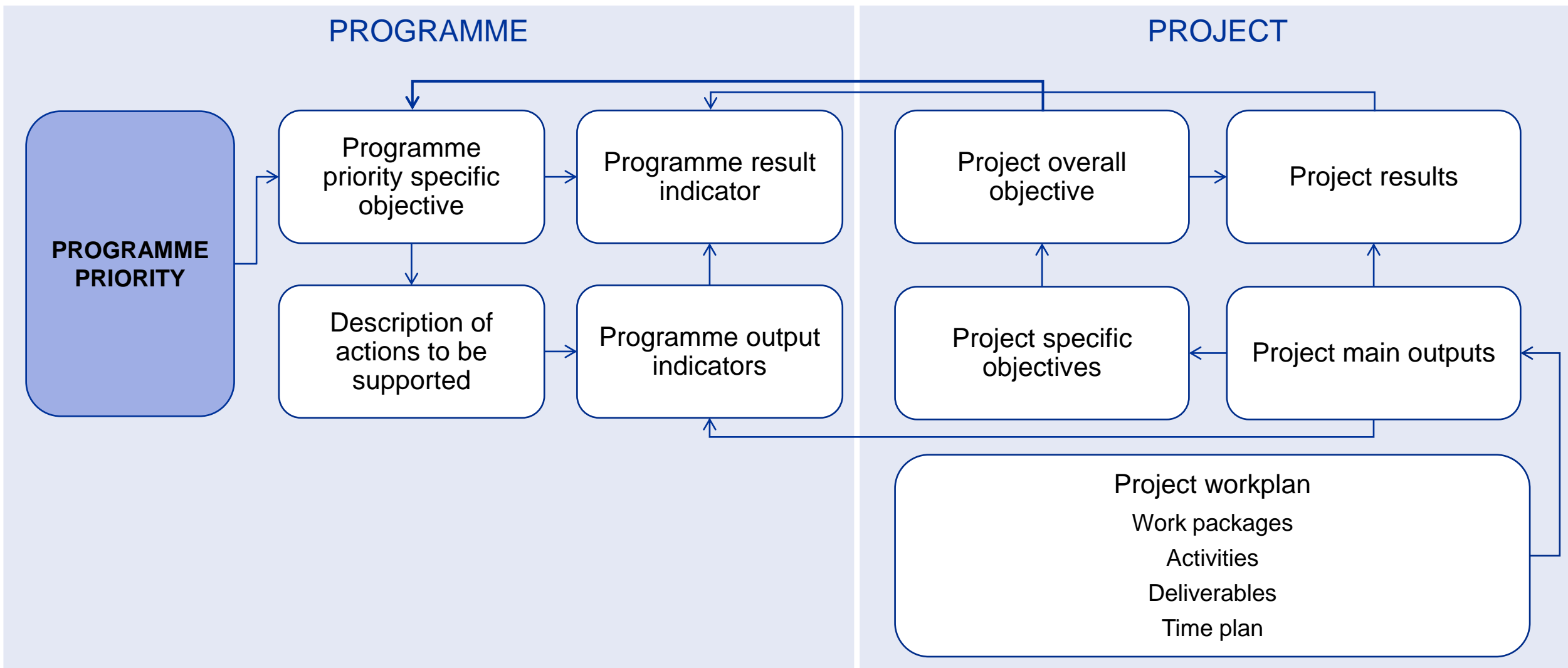

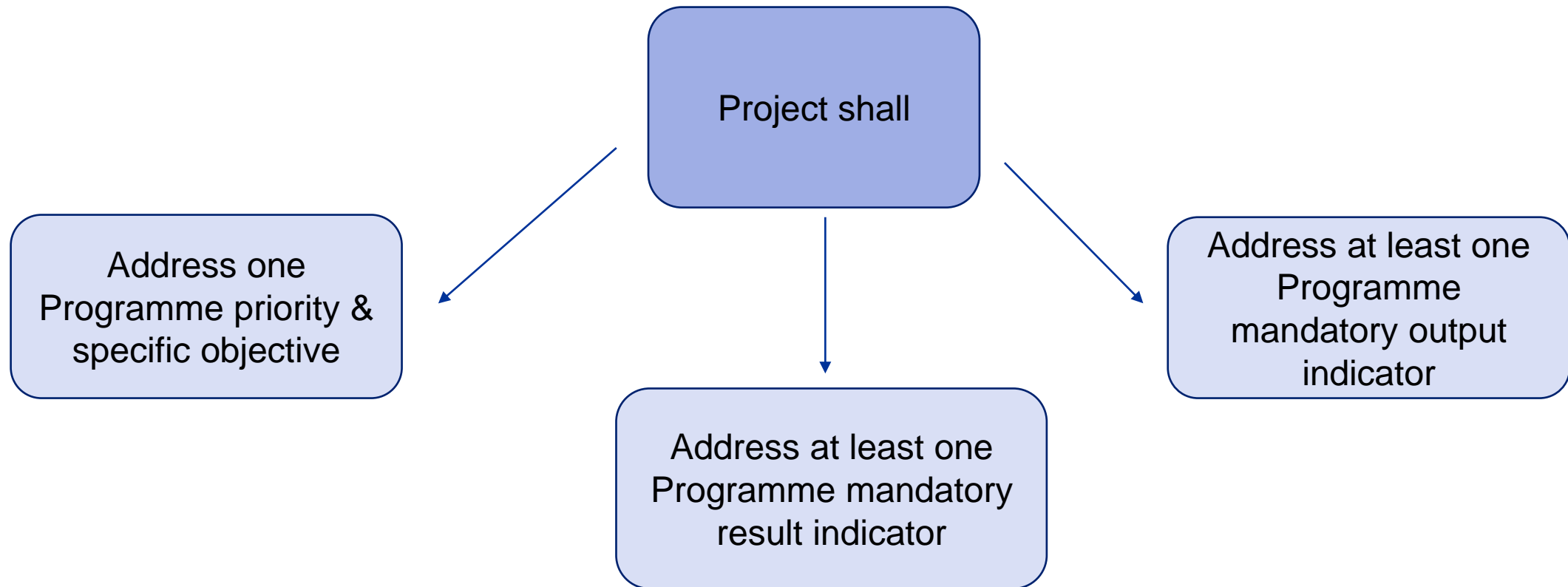

* Several Programme output indicators can be chosen in case several output indicators are developed for a particular Programme priority/specific objective

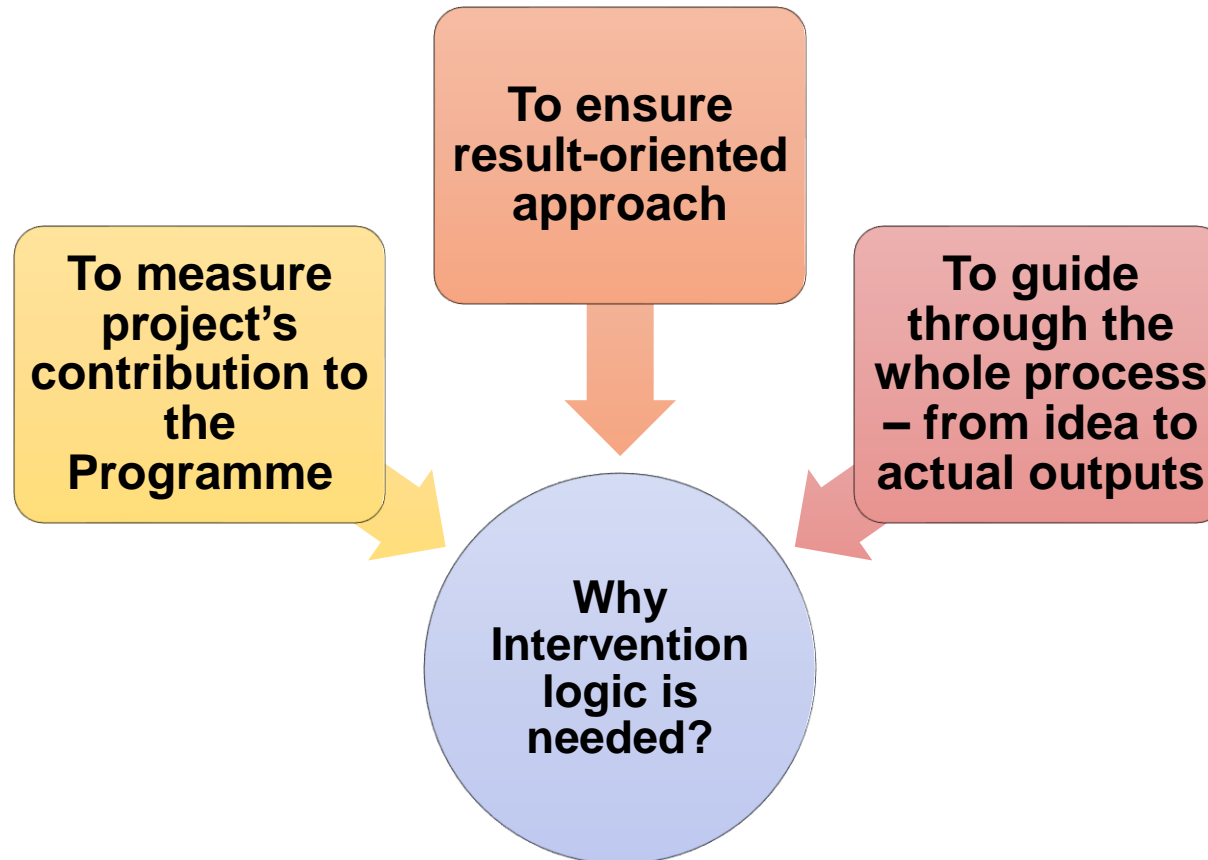

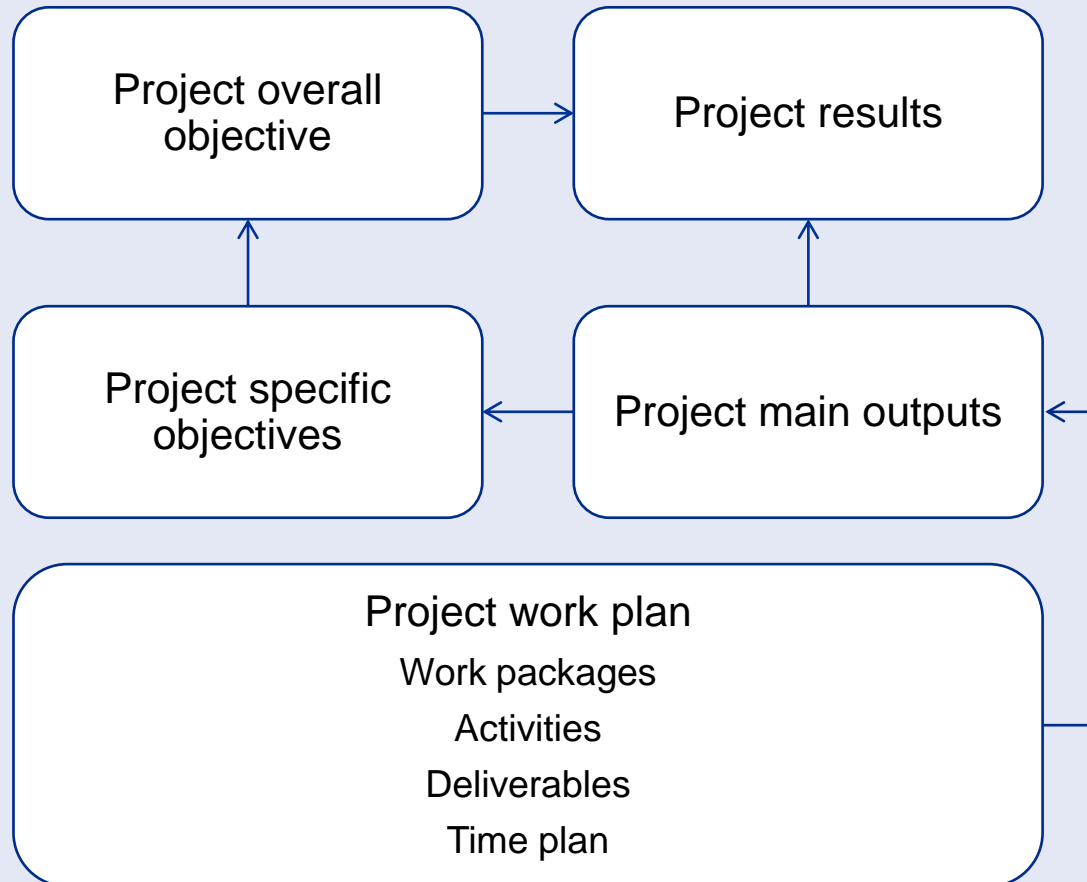

Project intervention logic

PROJECT



Project overall objective – provides overall context for what the project is trying to achieve, shall be linked to programme priority/specific objective.

Project specific objectives – a tangible statement describing what the project is trying to achieve.

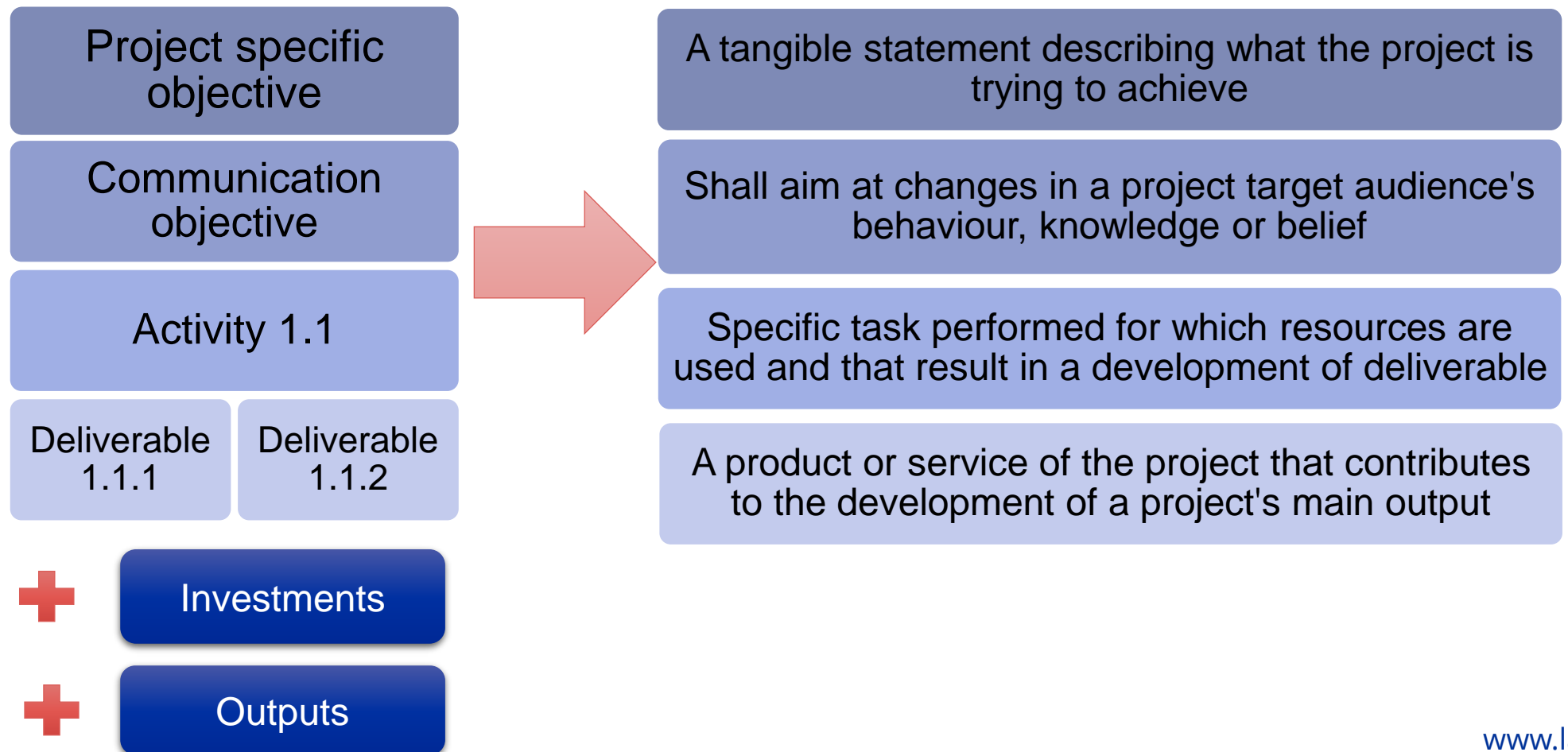
Project main output – a final product of the project that contributes to achievement of the project specific objectives.

Project result should indicate the change the project is aiming for.

Project work plan explains what needs to be done to deliver project main outputs and achieve project specific objectives.

Structure of work package

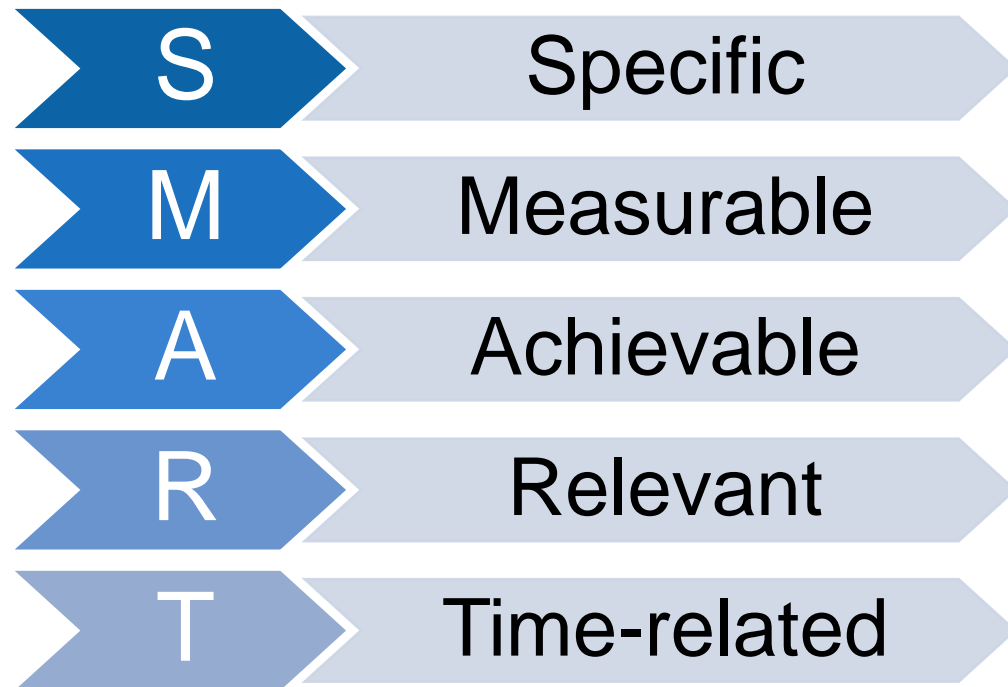


Project work plan

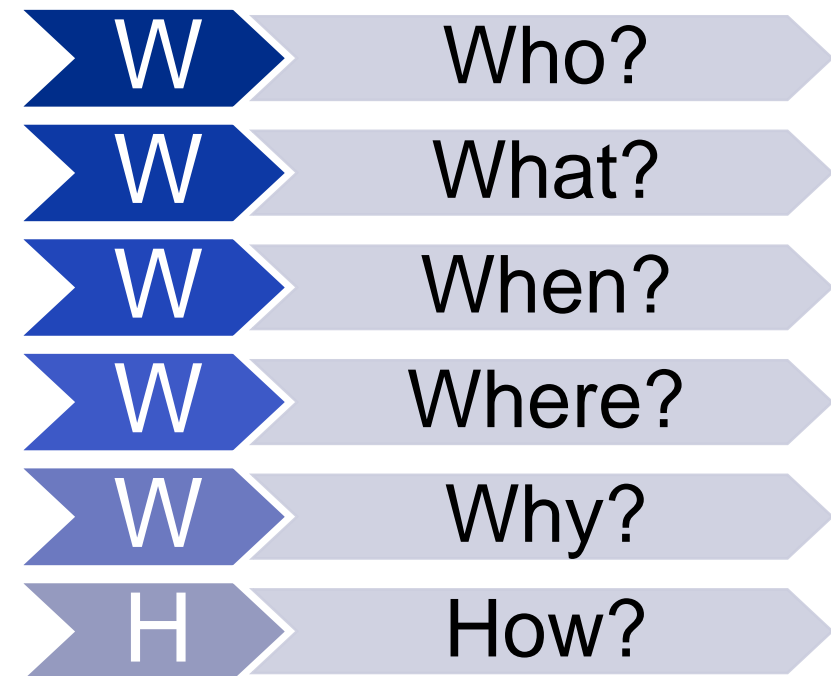
- Prepared for the whole project implementation period
- A basis for project implementation, reporting, monitoring, financial control and audit
- Changes in work plan, except some minor deviations, need prior approval by the JS, MA or MC
- Work plan is divided in several work packages (WPs) (up to 2-3)
- No separate WPs for project management, investments or communication
- All project activities should lead to the achievement of the main outputs of the project

Project specific objectives



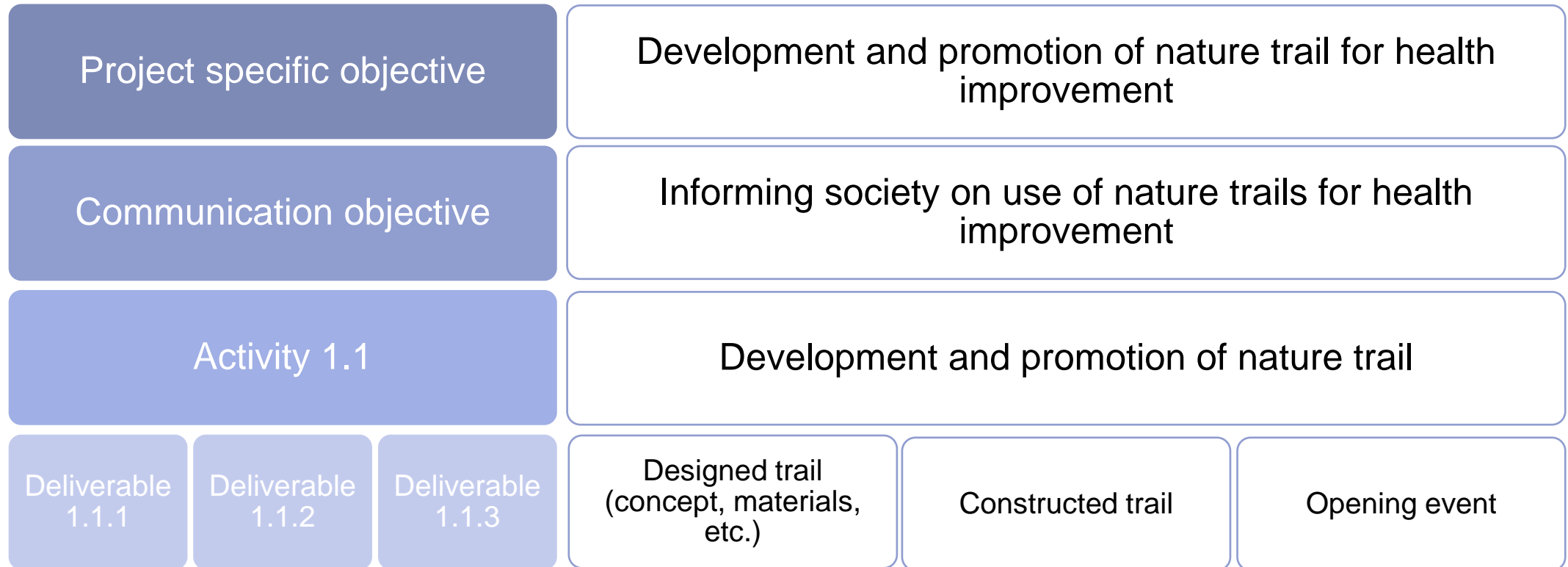
Deliverables



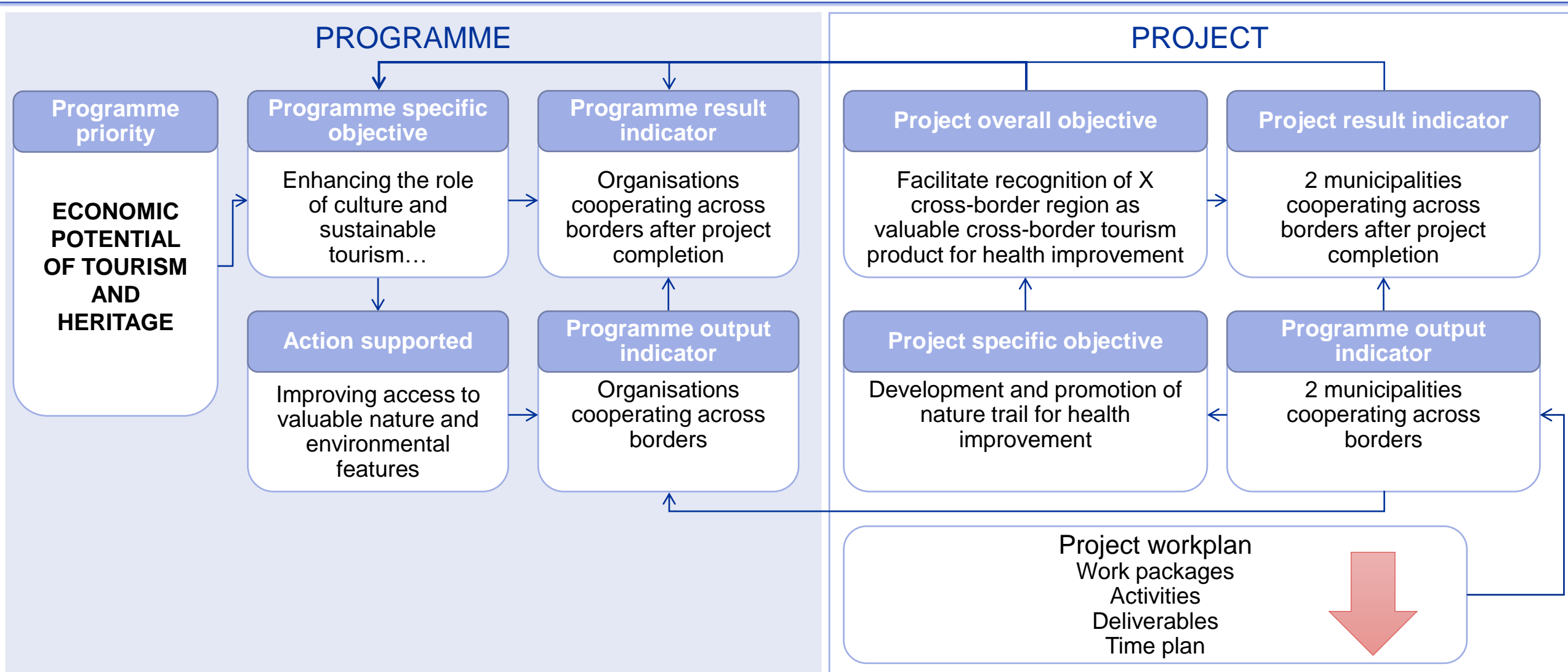
Activities shall include general information on planned specific task.
Every activity must have **at least one deliverable**.

Priorities I, II, III	Organisations cooperating across borders (mandatory)	Organisations cooperating across borders after project completion (mandatory)
	Pilot actions developed jointly and implemented in projects	Solutions taken up or upscaled by organisations
	Jointly developed solutions	
Priority IV	Organisations cooperating across borders (mandatory)	Organisations cooperating across borders after project completion (mandatory)
	Number of cultural and tourism sites supported	Visitors of cultural and tourism sites supported

- Organisations cooperating across borders = number of project partners, specify in one WP
- Project main output cannot be with value 0 and cannot be a deliverable
- For result indicators Programme will ask a report on their achievement one year after project end

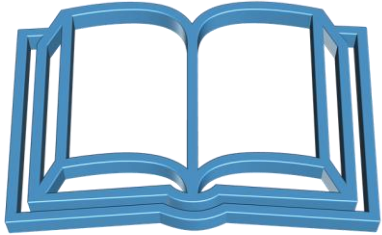
