In accordance with Article 69 Paragraph 8 of Common Provisions Regulation¹, all exchanges of information between the LP and the Programme bodies shall be carried out by means of electronic data exchange systems. Therefore, submission of applications, reporting, submission of requests for project changes, as well as any other communication regarding project and Programme implementation shall be done via JEMS.

JEMS is a monitoring system developed by INTERACT with communication portal to support submission, approval, management and administration of projects in the context of Interreg programmes. The system supports collection of all information on submitted and approved projects, their implementation and achievements, changes and closure. Additionally aggregated data on the progress of projects and the Programme level are recorded in the system. JEMS is built to support Programme bodies in day-to-day Programme management and should fulfil all legal requirements.

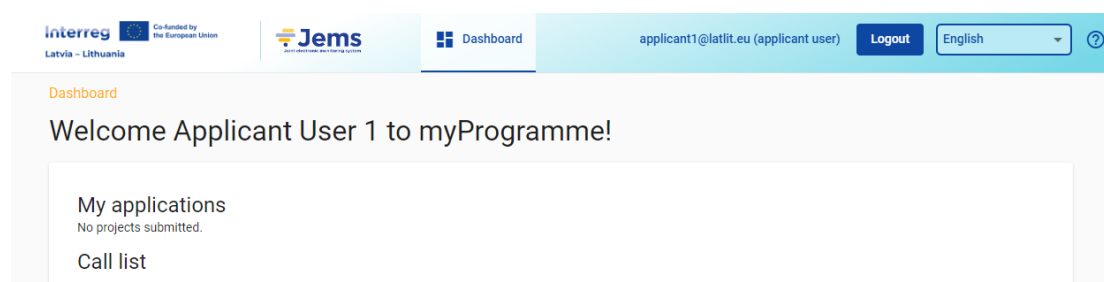

When logged in JEMS, you will see the main page (**Dashboard**).

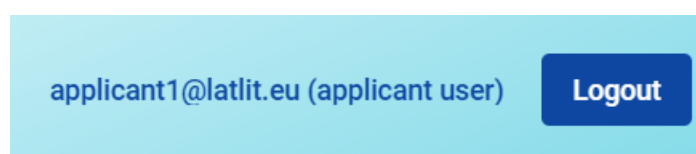


You can click “Dashboard” in the top menu bar to go to the Dashboard.

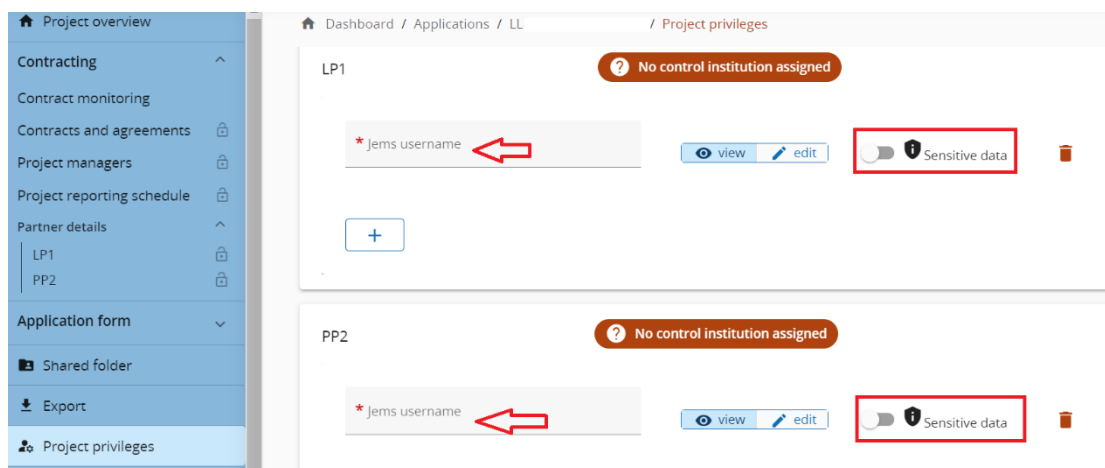
[At contracting and reporting phase](#)

Once the project has been approved by JS following the fulfilment of conditions, LP and PPs are required to review whether adjustments to access rights for the project are necessary. This may involve change of access from the person who prepared and submitted the application to the person responsible for project implementation.



Note! At least one user must have MANAGE rights.

To facilitate access to the preparation and submission of Partner Reports, users need to be assigned to each PP. This assignment grants them access not only to Partner Reports but also to the corresponding section of "Partner details" in the Contracting section.



Note!

- **PP's users automatically have "view" access to Project Reports.**
- **Only the user who has been added to the AF users / Project managers team in the section "Project privileges" and have EDIT or MANAGE right can create, edit and submit Project Reports.**
- **For LP to access Partner Reports, its user must be assigned to the respective PP(s).**
- **National Control institution users are assigned by the JS/MA.**

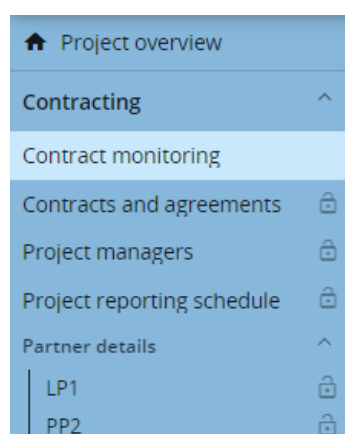

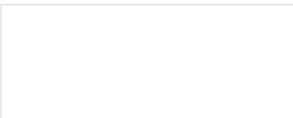

At this stage the status of the AF will be **“In modification”**. When the AF is updated, the LP submits it for verification and acceptance to JS.
- 4) After LP submitted the updated AF, the JS will assess it. If needed, it can be reverted (“Hand back to applicant”) for correction.
- 5) After the JS specifies the information, the status of the AF is changed to **“Contracted”**. For each modification respective version of the AF is available.

REPORTING

This section outlines the steps to complete and submit reports.

The aim of the reporting process is to establish whether project objectives have been achieved, what resources have been spent, what problems have been encountered, and whether the project is expected to be completed on time and within budget. If performance is sufficient, the project will receive payment from the Programme for costs incurred, paid and reported.

To ensure a good monitoring of the project implementation, projects are expected to submit a Partner Report and a Project Report on a 6-monthly basis. Reporting periods are individual per project and depend on the project's start date.

A **Partner Report** contains both activity and financial information that is necessary to verify individual PP's expenditure. PPs are responsible to complete and submit their Partner Reports to the National Controller in JEMS.

A **Project Report** contains both activity and financial information at project level and is necessary to claim funds from the Programme. LP is responsible to compile all necessary information from the PPs to complete and submit the Project Report in JEMS according to schedule specified in section "Contracting"/"Project reporting schedule".

A **Final report** is integrated in the Project Report for the last reporting period and includes questions on the achievement of the project objective, main output(s) and results.

A **Report on achieved project results** includes general information on the durability of outputs and results as well as follow-up activities after the project ended.

Reporting rules:

- Before submission of Partner Report for 1st period, LP checks if Partnership agreement and Confirmation of bank details are uploaded in JEMS (see section "Contracting" of this Guidance).
- Do not delay submission of reports; start preparation of reports on time.
- Create and submit the reports in consecutive order (1st period, 2nd period, etc.).
- Report preparation costs in Partner Report for 1st reporting period.
- Report costs and activities according to planned in the AF: specify costs under relevant CC; use the same titles for outputs, activities, and deliverables, if applicable, to link planned vs reported.
- Upload supporting documents to prove reported costs, deliverables, if applicable, and outputs. Upload documents in accurate manner: filename with reference to the content of the document and in comments section short description of the content of the file.
- Prepare reports in a good quality to spend less time for clarifications and get faster money from the Programme.
- Get approval on project changes till the end of reporting period in which they happened. Changes initiated during checking of reports delay approval of reports.
- Submit Confirmation of Project Report (Annex 3) together with Project Report in JEMS.

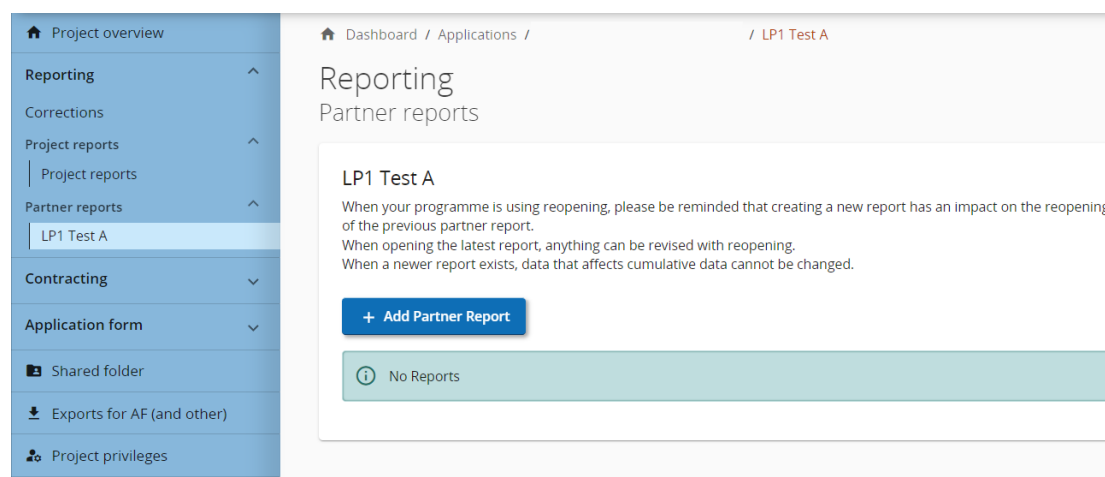
- It is possible to delete the report only as long as it has not been submitted to the National Control (for Partner Report) and to the JS for (Project Report).

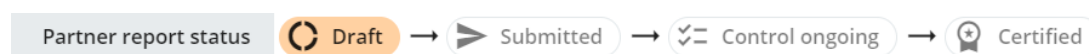

Annex 1: Terms of service, privacy policy and cookies usage policy for Jems

Terms of service, privacy policy and cookies usage policy for Jems

1. Subject matter and scope

1.1 The Interreg VI-A Latvia–Lithuania Programme 2021–2027 (hereinafter - Programme) Joint electronic monitoring system (hereinafter - Jems) is provided for applicants and project beneficiaries to allow them to create, prepare, revise and submit online forms (application and request for changes form, reports and payment claims and final reports). Furthermore, it is provided for the Programme bodies to do the project and Programme monitoring.

1.2 These Terms of Service govern the relation between:

Ministry of Smart Administration and Regional Development of Latvia, ensuring functions of the Managing Authority (hereinafter – MA) and Joint Secretariat (hereinafter - JS) of the Programme; and

Institutions/bodies acting as applicants in project proposals and beneficiaries in approved projects;

Other bodies and actors involved in the Programme implementation such as members of the Monitoring Committee, National Authorities, National Control bodies, Audit Authority, Members of the Group of Auditors in relation to their access to and use of the Jems.

1.3 Requesting access to the Jems, accessing the Jems or using the Jems signifies unconditional acceptance of these Terms of Service.

2. Jems users and organisations

2.1 Access to the Jems is open to natural persons with a valid email address. Access rights to certain information and functions in the Jems are restricted to users with specific roles in relation to particular proposals or projects. Project applicants and PPs' organisations shall access the Jems only via users employed by or representing them. If a user leaves the organisation or is no longer representing the organisation, the account of this person shall be closed and a new one shall be created if needed. 3. Using Jems

3.1 Users shall use Jems in accordance with these Terms of Service, in a responsible manner, and exclusively for their professional purposes and without breach of the rights of third parties.

3.2 Users are fully and unconditionally responsible for any use of Jems (including misuse of their means of access), and for any detrimental consequences that may arise directly or indirectly therefrom.

3.3 Organisations acknowledge and accept that they are responsible for the actions and omissions of users employed by or representing them.

3.4 The system keeps track of access to and use of Jems.

3.5 When full write and/or manage access are given to project partners by the Lead partner, project application, request for project modification and project progress report must however be submitted by a user employed by or representing the Lead partner's organisation.
